RULES REGARDING THE PUBLIC ADDRESSING A CITY MEETING

Any member of the public shall have the right to address the City Council, Board or Commission on any item on the agenda under the following conditions:

1. Individuals requesting to address City Council, a Board or Commission on an agenda item or under public comment must fill out a “*Request to Address*” card provided – listing name, address, phone number and agenda item on which comments are desired to be made and present it to the Clerk or recording secretary.
2. When the agenda item is reached, the clerk or recording secretary shall call upon the person or persons who filed the request to speak. A member of the public shall not be permitted to enter into debate with a petitioner.
3. Individuals that would like to address City Council under the public comment portion of the agenda, must raise their hand and when recognized by the chair, the person shall approach the microphone and state their name and address.
4. Remarks shall be limited to three (3) minutes, subject to being extended an additional three (3) minutes by consent of the chair. There shall be no personal attacks. Remarks shall not contain any profanity, racial, ethnic, religious, sexual or national origin slurs or overtones. Anyone making such remarks shall lose his/her right to address the City Council, Board or Commission.
5. No person shall be permitted to address the group on any item more than once at any one meeting without the approval of a majority of the quorum present.
6. All of the foregoing does not apply to a person previously granted a hearing at the meeting in question.
7. This rule does not permit members of the public to join in debate or discussion with petitioners, members of the body or with other members of the public present at such meeting.
8. Once a motion is on the floor, discussion from the public shall no longer be permitted on that agenda item.
9. The public may make a request to the Chairperson of the Council on a form provided by the Clerk, to be added to the agenda of a future Council meeting to address a subject that Council would have authority to address. If the Chairperson denies the request, the request may be made to the entire Council under the Public Comment section of the Council’s agenda. If the request is granted by a majority of the Council, it will be added as an agenda item at the next regular meeting of the Council.

The meeting will be held in the City Council Chambers, Romulus City Hall, 11111 South Wayne Road, Romulus, MI 48174. NOTE: Anyone planning to attend the meeting who has need of special assistance under the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA), is asked to contact the Clerk’s Office (734-942-7540) 48 hours prior to the meeting – the staff will be pleased to make the necessary arrangements.

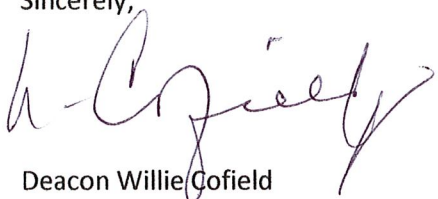

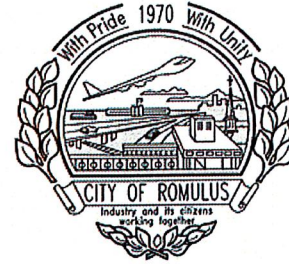

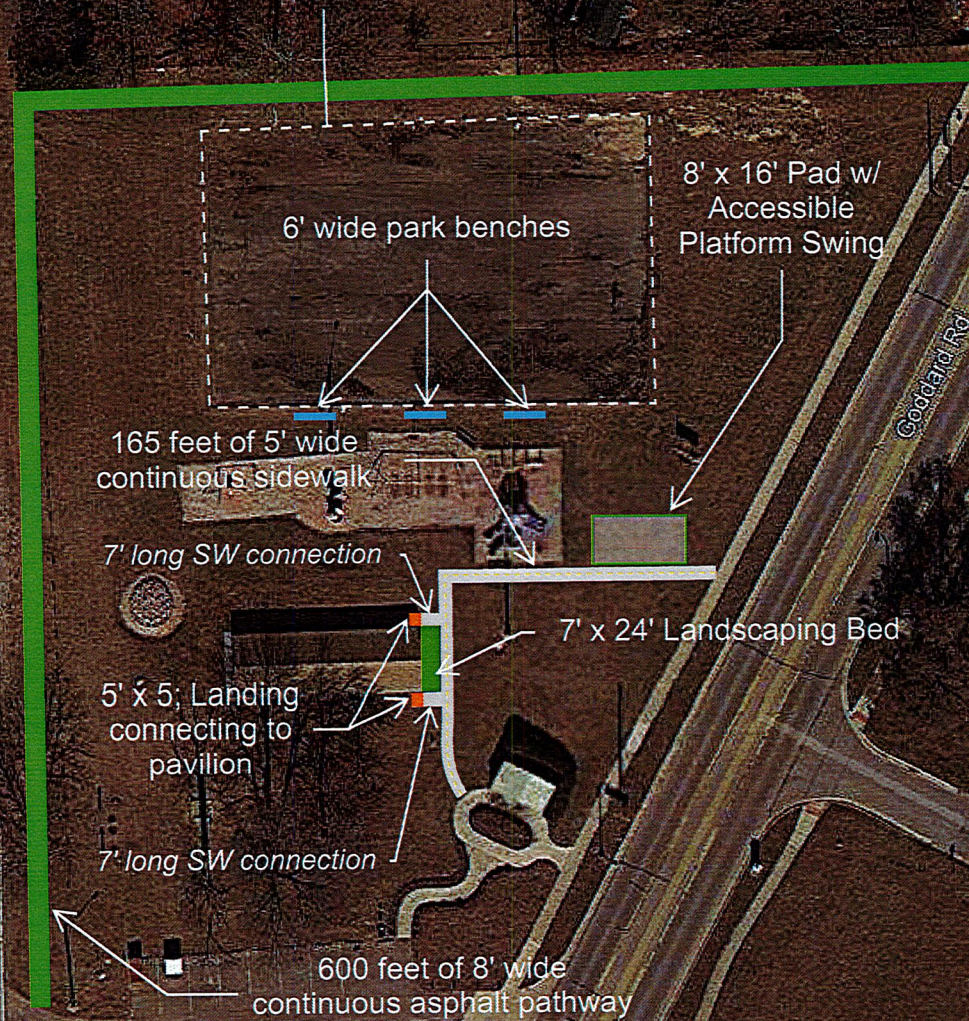

Attached is a proposed schematic of a 22'x22' comfort station/concession building to be considered for construction at Historical Park in Downtown Romulus.

The following are building details that are currently assumed for the purposes of the attached drawing:

- Building is brick veneer and concrete masonry with a 3" air space/insulation cavity.
- Roof is standing seam metal with cupola to match pavilion.
- Floor is sealed concrete (no finish).
- Interior walls are epoxy paint directly on concrete masonry.
- Ceiling is painted gypsum board.
- Counter shutter is a standard stainless steel rolling counter shutter with stainless steel shelf.
- Concession counters to be stainless steel. Sink provided.
- 10-gallon hot water heater and small furnace (can also be point of use hot water heat if requested).
- High/low outside water fountains provided.
- Doors are 16 gage galvanized hollow metal painted.

These items should be verified to be what is desired when considering the future programming of the building via input from stakeholders such as the DDA, Department Heads and City Officials. We can proceed with acquiring a cost estimate once these parameters are established.

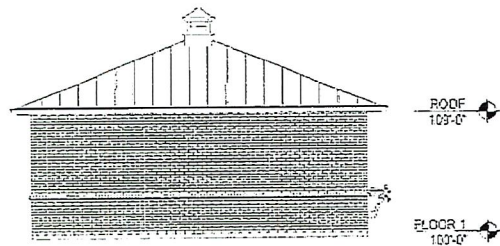

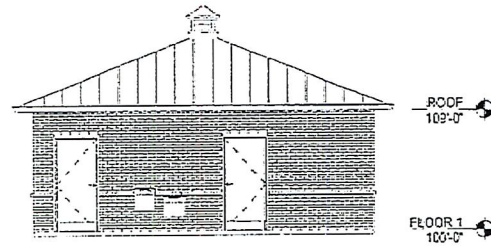

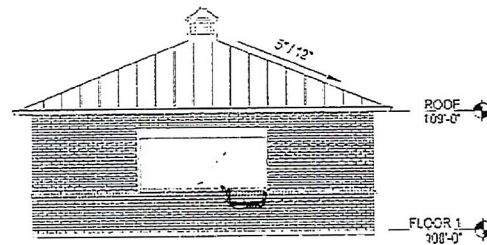
5 SCHEMATIC E ELEV

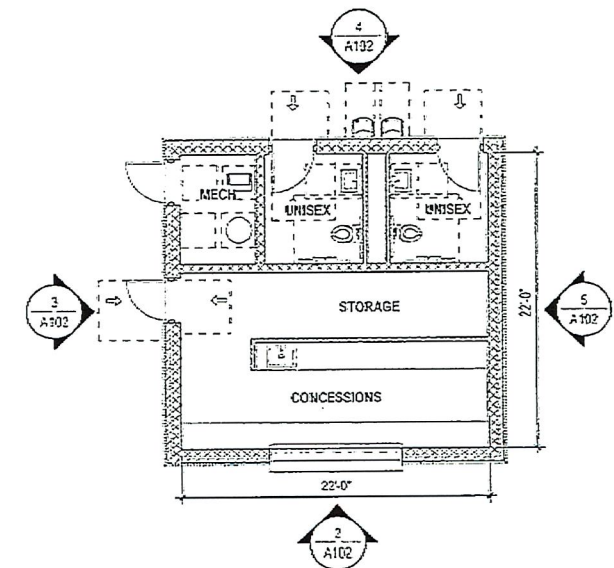
4 SCHEMATIC N ELEV

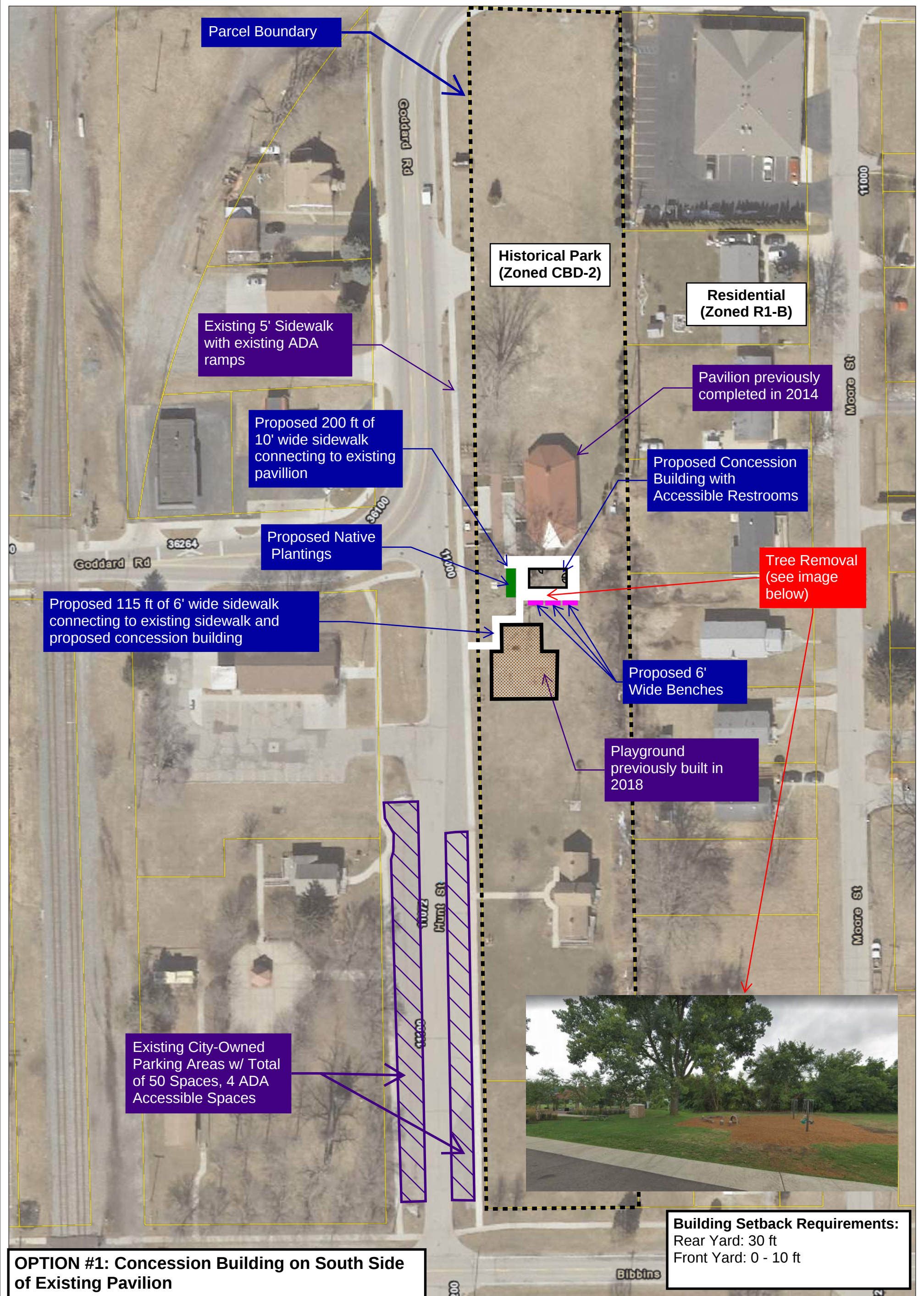

We are pleased to provide the following proposal for electrical repairs to rewire and install the following:

1. Remove conduits from the service equipment and SCADA system on the exterior to facilitate the removal of the building structure; make the electrical service safe to energize and install GFI protected work outlets for construction.

ARTICLE III. LICENSING OF ~~APARTMENT HOUSES, HOUSES, HOTELS, MOTELS, BED AND BREAKFAST AND, MOTOR COURTS AND ROOMINGHOUSES~~

Sec. 28-78. Definitions.

The following words, terms, and phrases, when used in articles II and III of this chapter, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

~~Apartment house means any dwelling, or portion thereof, which is hired out to be occupied or which is occupied as a home or residence for three or more families living independently of each other in dwelling units.~~

~~Bed and breakfast means a single family residential structure that has ten or fewer sleeping rooms, including sleeping rooms occupied by the innkeeper, and serves meals at no extra cost to its transient tenants. City means the City of Romulus.~~

~~Extended lodging facility means a residential facility intended to house a person for longer than one month, having apartment style units, each with its own kitchen and lavatory, suite or otherwise.~~

Family means one family unit, members of which are related by consanguinity or by marriage and shall also include those other persons six and less in number living together as a unit except for small group homes as defined under MCL 400.703 et seq., which are exempted from this article.

Hotel means a dwelling structure providing rooms in which no provision for cooking is made, and/or conference facilities are provided, and is subject to the innkeepers' guest laws of the state.

~~Lodginghouse and/or boardinghouse means a building or part thereof, other than a hotel or motel, where lodgings are provided for hire more or less transiently with or without provision of meals.~~

Motel and motor court means a dwelling structure providing rooms for rent to the public and subject to the innkeepers' guest laws of the state in which no provision for cooking is made in each dwelling unit.

~~Roominghouse means any dwelling, or that part thereof containing one or more rooming units, in which space is let by the owner or operator to three or more persons who are not husband and wife, son or daughter, mother or father, or sister or brother, or otherwise related by blood or marriage, for more than one month in duration.~~

Responsible Party means an individual residing in the State of Michigan who is designated by the Owner as the person who is responsible for the management of the Property and upon whom the City may serve all papers, motions and tickets with regard to enforcement of all City ordinances related to the Property.

(Code 1999, § 15-236; Ord. of 11-28-2005(02), § 1)

Sec. 28-79. Authority to make regulations.

The department of building and safety, the city fire department and police department are hereby authorized to make such rules and regulations as may be necessary to carry out the provisions of this article, copies of which shall be available for distribution to all interested persons.

(Code 1999, § 15-237; Ord. of 11-28-2005(02), § 1)

Sec. 28-80. Health requirements.

Premises licensed pursuant to this article shall at all times be occupied, kept and maintained in accordance with the applicable provisions of the building and housing ordinances and regulations of the city and the housing law of the state. Where under the terms of any rental agreement it is the duty of any licensee to furnish linens, the licensee shall provide all beds with regulation sheets and pillowcases, the same to be laundered at least once each week; provided that each new guest or patron shall be furnished with clean sheets and pillowcases. Where towels are provided, the same shall be individual towels, furnished clean to each guest or patron, and laundered at least once a week, and common towels shall not be permitted. Any licensee having notice or knowledge that the licensed premises contain any vermin shall, within 48 hours, report the same to the county board of health, and shall cause the same to be exterminated by such means as shall be approved by the county board of health, within five days from the date upon which licensee first had notice or knowledge of the existence of the same. Where food is served to guests in any premises, the licensee shall be subject to and shall fully comply with all provisions of chapter 26.

Sec. 28-81. Registration.

Every holder of a license for a ~~lodginghouse~~, hotel, motel, ~~bed or motor court and breakfast, roominghouse or extended lodging facility~~ shall provide and maintain a bound book in which shall be entered in ink, the name and home address of any person other than members of the same family as listed in the application for the license, occupying the premises or any part thereof. The register shall also show the make and license number of any motor vehicle owned or used by each registrant and list either the driver's license number or state identification number of each registrant. The register shall be maintained in the premises in plain view and in a convenient place near the main entrance and shall be submitted upon demand to any official or police officer of the city or to any public officer of the state. The register shall constitute a public record. This section does not apply to apartment houses or roominghouses.

(Code 1999, § 15-239; Ord. of 11-28-2005(02), § 1)

Sec. 28-82. Rental.

- (a) No room or unit of premises which is a ~~lodginghouse~~, hotel, motel, ~~or motor court extended lodging facility, or bed and breakfast~~, as defined in the provisions of this article, shall be rented or let for a period of less than 24 hours, nor shall any such room or unit be rented or let to more than one tenant for each 24-hour period. The right to occupy any such room or unit shall not be assigned, transferred, or sublet. No licensee shall approve, suffer, or permit the assignment, transfer or subletting of any such room or unit.
- (b) No such room or unit shall be used for any unlawful act. No person shall occupy or use as a guest or a tenant or be permitted to occupy or use as a guest or tenant any ~~lodginghouse~~, hotel, motel, ~~or motor court bed and breakfast~~, or other similar accommodations for a period of more than ~~one month~~ 30 days in any calendar year.

the licensee which will be effective ten days after notice if there is no appeal under section 28-94, for any of the following causes:

- (1) Fraud or misrepresentation in the application for license;
 - (2) Fraud or misrepresentation in the operation of the licensee's business;
 - (3) Any violation of this article;
 - (4) Any violation of the ordinances of the city;
 - (5) Any violation of the laws of the state or of the United States;
 - (6) Conducting a business in an unlawful manner or in such a manner as to constitute a breach of the peace or a menace to the health, morals, safety, or welfare of the public, or creates a nuisance;
 - (7) Any failure or inability on the part of the applicant to meet and satisfy the requirements and provisions of this article.
- (b) Written notice of refusal, revocation, or suspension, stating the cause therefor, shall be delivered to the applicant or licensee personally, or mailed to the address stated in his application.

BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of Romulus, Michigan, as follows:

1. The City Council by at least a three-fifths votes of its members-elect, pursuant to the authority granted by Act 279, Public Acts of Michigan, 1909, as amended, proposes that Section 11.1 of the Charter of the City of Romulus, shall be amended to read as follows:

Section 11.1. Taxation; General Powers.

The City shall have the power to assess taxes and levy and collect rents, tolls and excises. The City shall not have the power to levy an income tax. The annual ad valorem tax levy shall not exceed ten (10) mills of the assessed valuation of all real and personal property subject to taxation in the City as equalized by the State, exclusive of any levy required for the payment of principal and interest on present Township sewer and water indebtedness or on outstanding bonds of the City and exclusive of any levy authorized by statute to be made beyond the Charter tax rate limitation. In addition, the City shall have the power to levy an ad valorem tax in the amount not to exceed 0.4 percent (4 mills) of the taxable valuation of all such real and personal property for five (5) years, from 2024 through 2028, for fire and police services.

The existing Section 11.1 of the Charter of the City of Romulus to be altered by such proposal, if adopted, now reads as follows:

Section 11.1. Taxation; General Powers.

The City shall have the power to assess taxes and levy and collect rent, tolls and excises. The City shall not have the power to levy an income tax. The annual ad valorem tax levy shall not exceed ten (10) mills of the assessed valuation of all real and personal property subject to

taxation in the City as equalized by the State, exclusive of any levy required for the payment of principal and interest on present Township sewer and water indebtedness or on outstanding bonds of the City and exclusive of any levy authorized by statute to be made beyond the Charter tax rate limitation. In addition, the City shall have the power to levy an ad valorem tax in an amount not to exceed 0.4 percent (4 mills) of the taxable valuation of all such real and personal property for five (5) years, from 2019 through 2023, for fire and police services.

2. The proposed amendment to Section 11.1 shall be submitted to the electors in the following form:

Shall Section 11.1 of the Charter of the City of Romulus, Wayne County, Michigan, be amended to continue the levy by the City of an additional ad valorem property tax in an amount not to exceed four (4) mills for five (5) years, from 2024 through 2028, for fire and police services?

The City Clerk shall transmit copies of the proposed amendment to of Section 11.1 of the City Charter to the Governor of the State of Michigan for approval, and transmit a copy of the foregoing statement of purpose of the proposed amendment of Section 11.1 of the City Charter to the Attorney General of the State of Michigan for approval, as required by law.

4. The proposed charter amendment of Section 11.1 shall be, and the same is hereby ordered to be, submitted to the qualified electors of this City at a City election to be held on the same day as the primary election to be held in the City of Romulus, the 2nd day of August, 2022 and the City Clerk is hereby directed to give notice of the election and notice of registration thereof in the manner prescribed by law and to do all things and to provide all supplies necessary to submit the charter amendment to the vote of the electors as required by law.

5. The proposed amendment of Section 11.1 shall be published in full together with the existing charter provision altered or abrogated thereby as part of the notice of election.

6. The canvass and determination of votes of said question shall be made in accordance with the laws of the State of Michigan and the Charter of the City of Romulus.
